The Correctional Service of Canada (CSC) will continue to assist offenders in obtaining personal identification (ID) prior to release, including their health card. CSC has engaged with provincial/territorial partners for their support in establishing a process at all remand centres that would ensure that the available ID is transferred with the offender when they are admitted to CSC custody. Upon release, CSC policy requires that parole officers validate existing ID and assist the offender in applying for other ID as required. CSC will continue to work collaboratively with various stakeholders to prepare offenders for their release with the proper identification. In addition, CSC will work to improve collaboration with provincial and territorial health authorities with the objective of removing barriers to accessing health care cards.
