The Simcoe North Federal Liberal Electoral District Association (Simcoe North Federal Liberals) wishes to thank the Special Committee on Electoral Reform for providing an opportunity for organizations like ours to make a submission on the important matter of electoral reform.

At its meeting of September 15th, 2016, the Simcoe North Federal Liberals passed a resolution indicating that:

- We support electoral reform, and not the status quo;
- We endorse the five principles guiding the work of the Special Committee; and
- We wish to see 'made in Canada' electoral reform that respects our diversity and geography, and borrows from the best electoral systems around the world, in place on time for the 2019 federal election.

To assist the Special Committee in its work, the Simcoe North Federal Liberals conducted an anonymous online survey of Simcoe North residents between September 20th, 2016, and October 5th, 2016. The survey was designed to find out where residents stand on various questions pertaining to electoral reform. The survey tool prevented more than one survey from being completed on the same device.

The survey was disseminated via a variety of means including traditional media (two newspaper stories), Facebook posts and shares, email, and word of mouth.

Participation in the survey was robust, and there was representation from all eight municipalities and both First Nations comprising the Electoral District of Simcoe North.

In total, 566 residents of Simcoe North participated in the survey, and there were 458 completed responses. The following is an overview:

- On the First-Past-the-Post (FPP) system of balloting:
 - o 22% said leave it the way it is
 - 78% said replace it

- 85% are either very familiar or somewhat familiar with Proportional Representation (PR) and/or Ranked Balloting (RB), 15% said they were not at all familiar
- 80% feel that PR represents an improvement over FPP, 20% do not
- 79% feel that RB represents an improvement over FPP, 21% do not
- As for which of the alternatives to FPP is the best one to purse at this time, respondents said:
 - o RB 45%
 - o PR 55%
- 78% support Electronic Voting at Polling Places as an alternative to the paper ballot, 22% oppose
- 69% support Electronic Voting Online where electors vote by inputting a Personal Identification Number (PIN) via a computer or mobile device, 31% oppose
- 32% support lowering the Voting Age to 16, 68% oppose
- 10% support lowering the Voting Age to 14, 90% oppose

- Mandatory Voting is supported by 50% of respondents, 50% are opposed
- Election Campaigns of Fixed Length is supported by 90%, 10% are opposed
- 97% support Increased Powers for Elections Canada to investigate questionable election practices, 3% oppose
- 95% support Increased Powers for Elections Canada to educate Canadians on our electoral system in order to encourage voting, 5% oppose
- 39% support Government subsidies to registered political parties based on the number of votes they received in the last general election, 61% oppose
- 7% support longer election campaigns, 93% oppose
- 6% support higher spending limits for longer election campaigns, 94% oppose

The Simcoe North Federal Liberals wish to thank the Special Committee on Electoral Reform for receiving our submission. We hope that the findings of our survey of residents of Simcoe North will provide the Committee with useful input in developing its recommendations. The full survey report follows:










Q4: How familiar are you with the two main options for electoral reform, Proportional Representation (PR) and Ranked Balloting (RB)?




Q6: Do you feel that the Ranked Ballot (RB) represents an improvement over the First Past the Post (FPP) ballot?




Q8: Would you support Electronic Voting at Polling Places as an alternative to the paper ballot?


Q9: Would you support Electronic Voting Online where electors vote by inputting a Personal Identification Number (PIN) via a computer or mobile device?

Q10: Would you support lowering the Voting Age to 16?




Q10: Would you support lowering the Voting Age to 16?




Q11: Would you support lowering the Voting Age to 14?


Q12: Do you support Mandatory Voting?


Q13: Do you support election campaigns of Fixed Length (rather than the Prime Minister deciding how long the election writ period will be)?


Q14: Do you support Increased Powers for Elections Canada to investigate questionable election practices?


Q15: Do you support Increased Powers for Elections Canada to educate Canadians on our electoral system in order to encourage voting?


Q16: Do you support Government subsidies to registered political parties based on the number of votes they received in the last general election?

Q17: Do you support longer election campaigns?




Q17: Do you support longer election campaigns?




