Responses

1. Economic Recovery and Growth

Given the current climate of federal and global fiscal restraint, what specific federal measures do you feel are needed for a sustained economic recovery and enhanced economic growth in Canada?

We need to adopt an outlook that takes into account all of Canadian industry. In light of the current global climate, we must realize that we do not operate in a vacuum and that we have to contribute to the global economy.

2. Job Creation

3. Demographic Change
