Responses

1. Economic Recovery and Growth

Given the current climate of federal and global fiscal restraint, what specific federal measures do you feel are needed for a sustained economic recovery and enhanced economic growth in Canada?

2. Job Creation

Encourage development of a home grown green economy that moves us away from dependance on fossil fuels and their associated damaging effects on our planet. Remove oil industry subsidies. Move the country toward a sustainable economy, not continued unsustainable growth.

3. Demographic Change

What specific federal measures do you think should be implemented to help the country address the consequences of, and challenges associated with, the aging of the Canadian population and of skills shortages?

Promote and foster increased R & D in health related areas. Increase funding for health care infrastructure improvements. Support the Provinces with improvements in their education systems to keep more kids in school and make health care professions more attractive to graduates.

4. Productivity

With labour market challenges arising in part as a result of the aging of Canada's population and an ongoing focus on the actions needed for competitiveness, what specific federal initiatives are needed in order to increase productivity in Canada?

More funding for R & D. Develop a national strategy on productivity in consultation with the Provinces. Help Canadians understand the importance of being productive and what that means.

With some Canadian individuals, businesses and communities facing particular challenges at this time, in your view, who is facing the most challenges, what are the challenges that are being faced and what specific federal actions are needed to address these challenges?
