### Responses

### 1. Economic Recovery and Growth

Given the current climate of federal and global fiscal restraint, what specific federal measures do you feel are needed for a sustained economic recovery and enhanced economic growth in Canada?

Devalue the over inflated dollar. Support a made in Canada policy, which would create real jobs, and increase the tax base.

#### 2. Job Creation

As Canadian companies face pressures resulting from such factors as uncertainty about the U.S. economic recovery, a sovereign debt crisis in Europe, and competition from a number of developed and developing countries, what specific federal actions do you believe should be taken to promote job creation in Canada, including that which occurs as a result of enhanced internal and international trade?

Any products used or purchased by the Federal Gov't should be Canadian made. Food, beverage, Vehicles, pens or papper. No matter how big or small. Get rid of NAFTA, stop the Free Trade Deals, support Canadian jobs, and Canadian workers. Re-negotiate an Auto Agreement stating for every vehicle sold in Canada, one needs to be built here.
