## Responses

## 1. Economic Recovery and Growth

Given the current climate of federal and global fiscal restraint, what specific federal measures do you feel are needed for a sustained economic recovery and enhanced economic growth in Canada?

Maintaining the current programmes and services on which the public relies. Scientific programmes in particular need to be maintained in order to guarantee the safety of citizens into the future. Infrastructure programmes should also be invested in so that employment is helped and an investment in the future is guaranteed.

#### 2. Job Creation

As Canadian companies face pressures resulting from such factors as uncertainty about the U.S. economic recovery, a sovereign debt crisis in Europe, and competition from a number of developed and developing countries, what specific federal actions do you believe should be taken to promote job creation in Canada, including that which occurs as a result of enhanced internal and international trade?

Infrastructure such as roads, sewers and rapid transit will help with employment and build the necessary advantages for the future while helping with employment in the present.

## 3. Demographic Change

What specific federal measures do you think should be implemented to help the country address the consequences of, and challenges associated with, the aging of the Canadian population and of skills shortages?

Programmes that help keep the elderly autonomous and in their homes for as long as possible are absolutely necessary.

#### 4. Productivity

With labour market challenges arising in part as a result of the aging of Canada's population and an ongoing focus on the actions needed for competitiveness, what specific federal initiatives are needed in order to increase productivity in Canada?

Insuring that the jobs available pay living wages with an emphasis on equitable and guaranteed pensions.

### 5. Other Challenges

With some Canadian individuals, businesses and communities facing particular challenges at this time, in your view, who is facing the most challenges, what are the challenges that are being faced and what specific federal actions are needed to address these challenges?
