RECOMMENDATION 4

Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada and the Canada Border Services Agency should improve information sharing to ensure that individuals linked to fraud investigations receive additional review to confirm their eligibility for citizenship.

MANAGEMENT RESPONSE (TO BE INCLUDED IN THE REPORT)

Agreed. The Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) recognizes the need to share relevant information on immigration fraud with Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) in a timely and accurate manner, without creating a negative impact on ongoing investigations, to assist IRCC in identifying individuals who may not be eligible to become Canadian citizens.

The CBSA, will conduct an assessment of the information that is needed by IRCC for *Citizenship Act* eligibility decisions; and the information on immigration fraud that can be provided by the CBSA within the current legislative authorities under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*, given the necessity of protecting the integrity of ongoing investigations, as well as the procedures that are currently in place between the two organizations to share information on immigration fraud.

In addition, the CBSA will develop a process that establishes when and how CBSA officers will be expected to share information on immigration fraud with IRCC.

These measures will be completed by December 2016.
